**Intro to Grad Lit Study in Greek** is an intensive reading class. This term we will focus on Athenian prose works (drawn from the PhD reading list) that remember and re-interpret Athens in the last quarter of the 5<sup>th</sup> c. BCE: Plato's Gorgias, Thucydides 6:8-33 and Andocides' On the Mysteries. As we read the select works at a brisk pace (roughly 10 OCT pages a wk), we will discuss and explore the cultural, literary and political dimensions of what (in every representation) looks like a major turning point for Athenian elite culture.

**Requirements.**

- 1) 2 reading tests: a midterm and an end-of-term test.
- 2) paper and/or presentation (optional).
- 3) 10 hour-long at home sight-reading quizzes.
- 4) Attendance, class preparation and willingness to participate.
